


We see many things around us. These things can be divided into two groups— **Living** and **Non-living**.



Non-living Things


Non-living things do not eat, need air or feel. They cannot move or grow. They also cannot have babies.

Non-living things are divided into two groups— Natural things and Human-made things.


GREEN TIP
